

PUBLIC HOUSING ADMISSION CRITERIA

The guidelines below will assist you in determining your eligibility for admission to Public Housing.

Eligible applicants must meet the following income guidelines effective 2018:

Number of Persons	Maximum Income
1.	\$42,600
2.	\$48,650
3.	\$54,750
4.	\$60,800
5.	\$65,700
6.	\$70,550
7.	\$75,400
8.	\$80,300

You **may be ineligible** for admission to public housing if any of the following apply to you:

- Your annual income exceeds the maximum limits.
- You owe an outstanding balance due under the law to a public housings authority or a private landlord. An owing balance includes unpaid rent, maintenance charges, and legal costs. Applicants may provide evidence of mitigating circumstances relating to the outstanding balance (for example, loss of income), which will be reviewed by the Occupancy Department before a decision on eligibility is made.
- You have a criminal history of drug possession and/or sales, disorderly conduct, physical violence and /or other criminal activity that would adversely affect the health, safety or welfare of other residents.

NOTE: If you application is rejected or withdrawn for any reason, you will be given notice of opportunity to dispute this decision at an administrative hearing.
